The Familial Mediterranean Fever from the modern postnonclassic scientific viewpoint

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Background

The Familial Mediterranean Fever (FMF) as a genetic disease with autosom-recessive transmitting mechanism and a clinical unclear, enigmatic, aimlessly spread aseptic inflammation finds a new solution from the viewpoint of psychosomatic theory [1], where are covered integral (psychic, physical), hierarchic, selfregulatory, selfdeveloping and selforganizing approaches. Somatoform disorders which exist among all the patients suffering from FMF [2] according to the modern FMF classification are not diagnosed and treated in time which is the reason for the progress of this disease as far as the internists diagnosed FMF only in case of availability of aseptic inflammation.

Materials and methods

Aseptic inflammation [3] is connected with the consequence of the traumas borne in the past which are realized in the unfavourable conditions of the present life, when the disease is gradually deepening as mentioned above. The aseptic inflammation according to the self regulating mechanism of the organism is the replying reaction to the trauma, which is becoming more and more frequent, as the patients suffering from FMF and having bad psychological defensive mechanisms are adapted to the exterior world with difficulty. The frequently processing unregulatory aseptic inflammations represent a great danger for the regulation of homeostasis, which according to the approach of self-regulation the body responses with over-spread ameloïdosis.

Results

The deepening of ameloïdosis which leads to the death of the patients, strengthens the patient's hopelessness in the struggle for life, as they know that they are suffering from incurable disease and can see the how ends ameloïdosis on their relatives. Thus the system leads him to death, dis-

arrangement of the desorganism, development of entropy.

Discussion

The dynamic process – the system can be regulated with psychotherapy, bringing the system to regulation, the decrease of entropy, the disappearance of the attacks and the prevention and treatment of ameloïdosis, which can be observed among our recovered patients.
